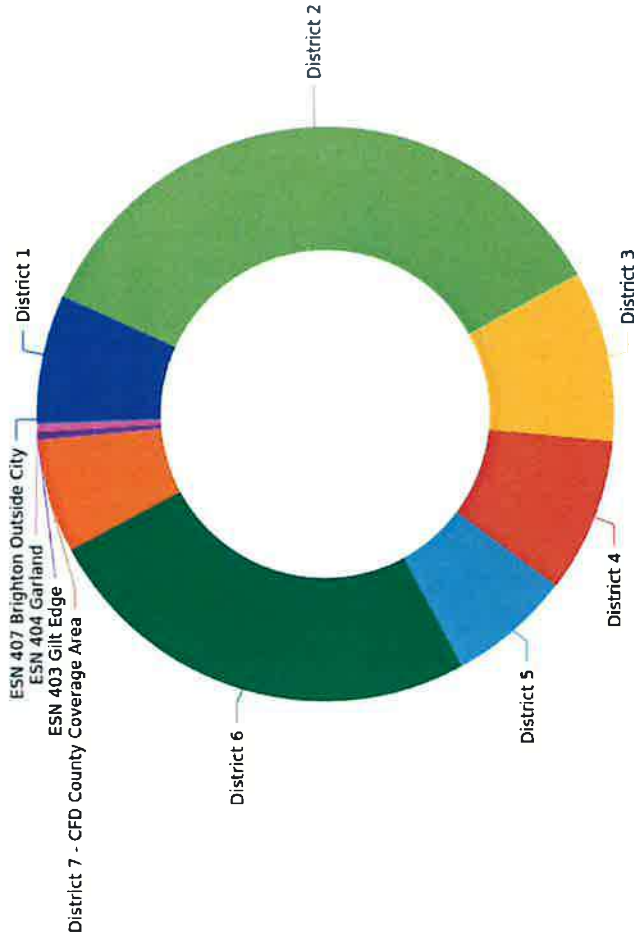

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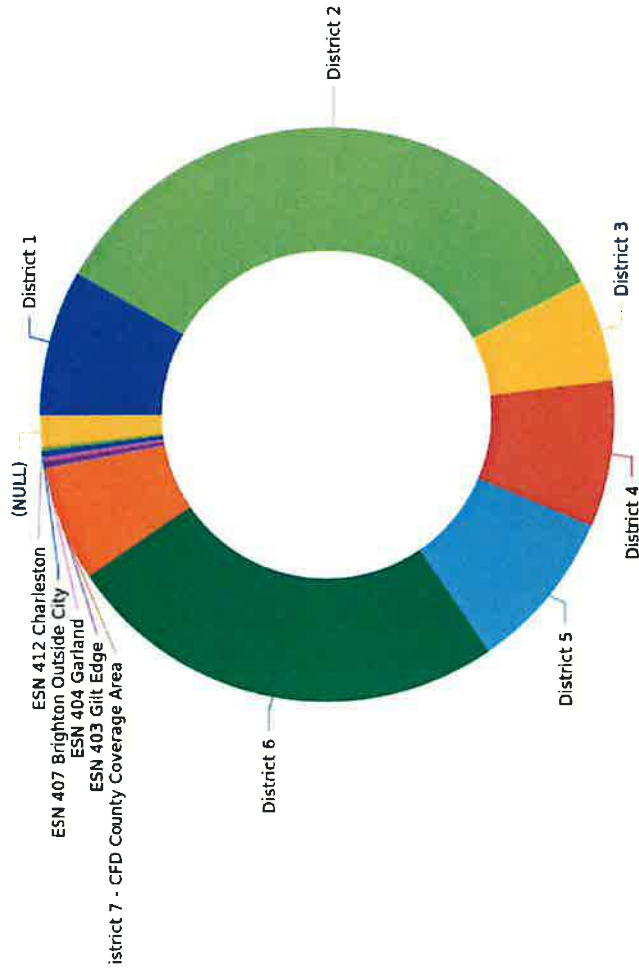

OSHA Compliance Director Report

Over the last month, I have worked with Human Resources and the Safety Committee to thoroughly address Safety and Health issues within the city. The Safety Council meeting was conducted on Thursday, Feb.26, 2026, at 1:30 PM in Parks and Rec. building at 790 Burt Johnson Ave. HR Director Bumpus and I discussed several issues on safety compliance and then the safety committee conducted a Fire and Life Safety walk-through inspection of the facility.

Initial Findings:

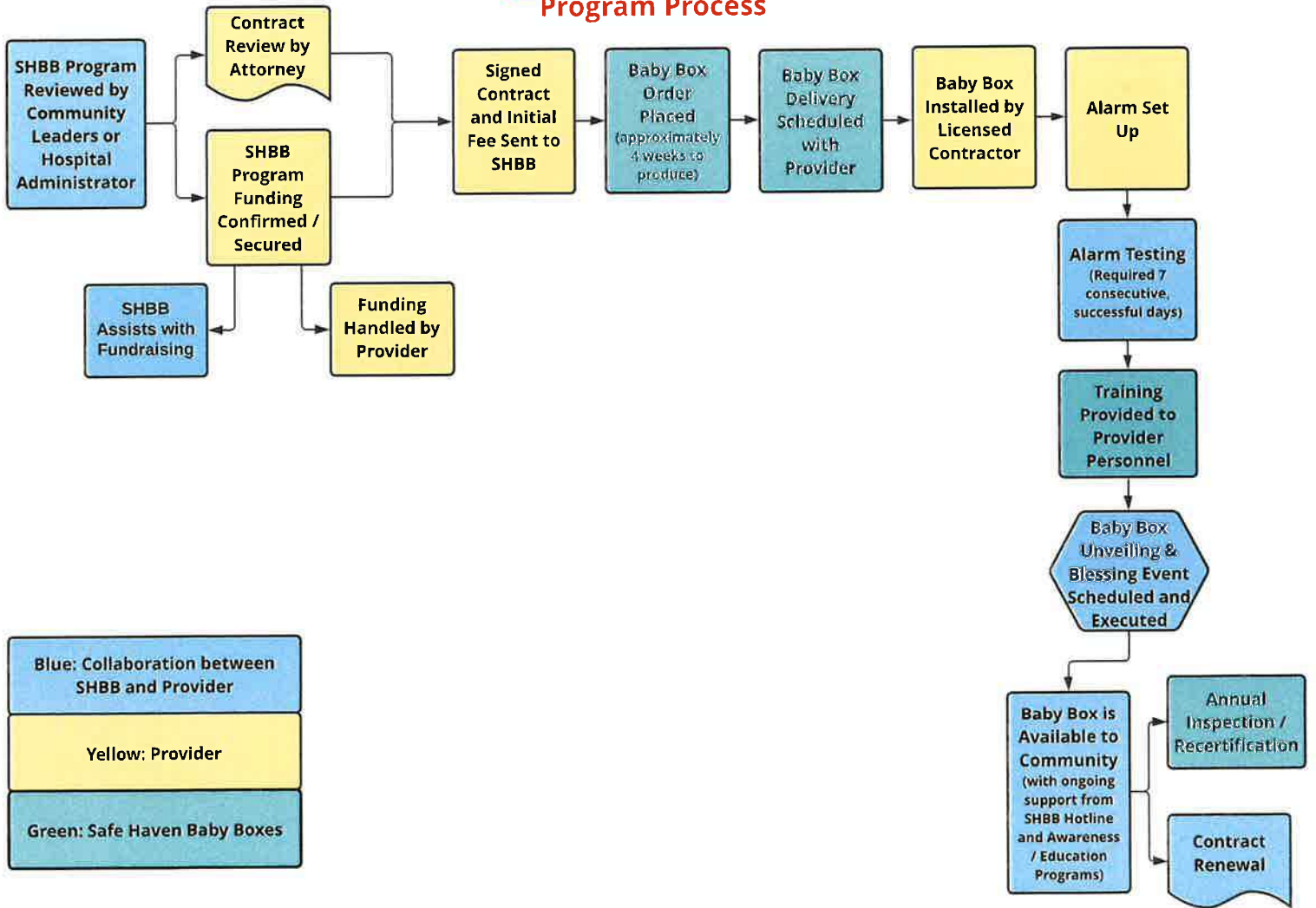
- Several escutcheon plates were missing- These are decorative rings that cover gaps around pipes and sprinkler heads in the ceiling tiles to prevent flow paths.
- Misuse of multiplug adapters- Multiplug adapters were daisy chained to refrigerators and microwaves or extension cords were plugged into the adapters.
- There were Fire EXIT /Emergency Lighting sign combos that were not working with back-up power.
- Some of the HVAC/Hot Water closets that had storage in them.
- Improper storage of cooking LPG inside the facility.

These issues were brought to the attention of the Department Head or their Representative to be mitigated, and ideas were provided to help with that timely mitigation.

Conclusion: I attest that my efforts have significantly contributed to public safety by conducting essential fire inspections, ensuring compliance with fire and life safety regulations during business inspections, and assisting in various critical inspections related to building codes enforcement. These activities are crucial for safeguarding lives, protecting property, and promoting a safe environment within the community. Keeping the community and our employees out of harm's way is the mission. I have also addressed many health and safety issues with the City of Covington personnel to ensure workplace safety and support a healthier workforce.

Valentine's Days turns into a Violent-Times Day

On February 14, 2026, Officers with the Covington Police Department executed an arrest warrant out of Tipton County in the **1500 block of Sandpiper Drive in Covington**, for charges of Theft of Property over \$2,500 and Evading Arrest. Officers located and arrested **Quinton Hill, 38, of Stevens Drive in Covington.**

As officers attempted to take Hill into custody, he actively fought and resisted, creating a volatile and dangerous situation. Officers issued repeated commands, but Hill continued to struggle and assault officers during the encounter. In order to safely gain control, one officer deployed a drive stun, after which Hill was taken into custody.

Two officers sustained minor injuries during the incident, including hand lacerations, and damage to one Officer's eyeglasses. Both were evaluated following the encounter. Hill was transported to Baptist Memorial Hospital Tipton for protocol medical clearance prior to being transported to Tipton County Jail booking.

Hill is now facing additional charges of **2 counts of Assault on a First Responder, Resisting Arrest, and Vandalism under \$1,000.** He is currently being held at Tipton County Jail pending his appearance in Court on the outstanding warrant and a \$100,000 bond was set for the additional charges per Tipton County General Sessions Court Judge M.O. Eckel, III.

"This incident highlights the dangers officers face when attempting to lawfully take individuals into custody," said Chief Donna Turner "When someone chooses to fight law enforcement in Tipton County, the Courts recognize that behavior as a threat to public safety. Bonds are set to reflect that concern and to protect our community. I am thankful our officers were able to safely resolve this situation and that their injuries were minor and Hill was uninjured."

Covington Police Responds to Shots Fired Call; Adult and Juvenile Charged

On 31 January 2026 the Covington Police Department responded to a shots fired call in the 800 block of Rose Street. While on the scene, CPD officers spoke with the complainant that advised her son was in his bedroom with his friend, playing with a gun. While the two were playing with the gun, the gun went off, striking a wall in the residence. The friend, **Amera Mason**, 18, of Covington, Tennessee left the scene prior to CPD officer's arrival. CPD officers located and detained Mason in the area and detained the 15-year-old Covington juvenile on the scene. Both the juvenile and Mason were transported to the Covington Police Department Criminal Investigation Division (CID). The juvenile's mother responded to assist in determining what occurred during the incident. Detectives responded to process the scene for evidence and assist officers in locating the weapon.

While at CID, the pair were formally charged. Detectives continue to conduct interviews to determine who fled the scene with the weapon. Additional charges are expected in the case.

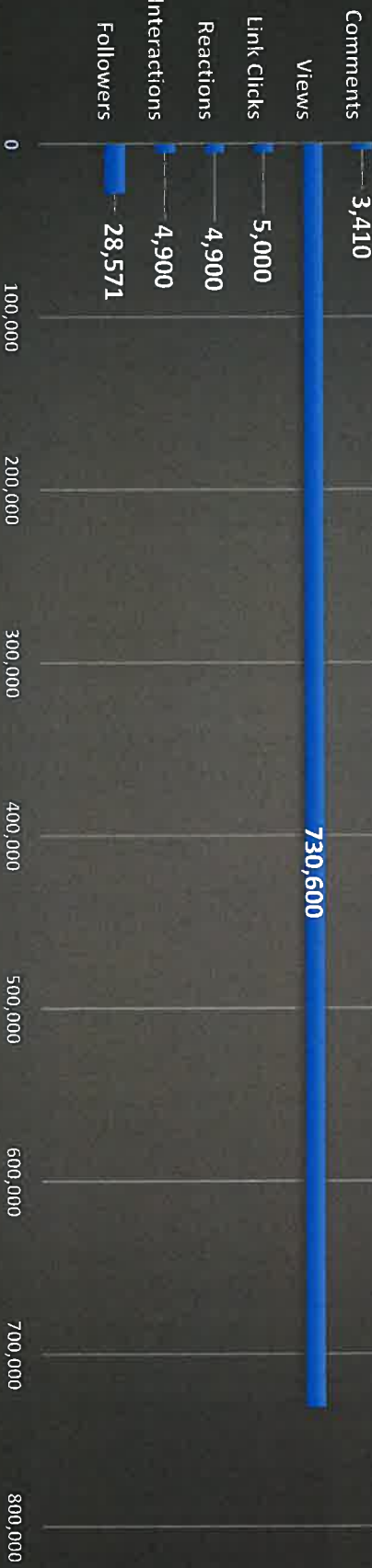
Mason was charged with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, Tampering with Evidence, 3 Counts of Reckless Endangerment, and Unlawful Possession of a Handgun. Mason was transported to the Tipton County Jail, where she is being held for her appearance in the Tipton County General Sessions Court by Tipton County General Session Court. Mason is scheduled to appear before Judge M.O. Eckel, III on Tuesday, 3 February 2026. The juvenile was charged with Tampering with Evidence, 3 counts of Reckless Endangerment, and Unlawful Possession of a Handgun. The juvenile received an ankle monitor from Tipton County Juvenile Court and released to the custody of his parents.

'This incident could have been tragic. The improper supervision of children with handguns often becomes deadly. Please make sure your handguns are safely stored in your home to prevent accidental discharges." said Chief Donna Turner "The weapon was given to someone prior to officers' arrival. Detectives will track down the vehicle and the people. Once they are located, they will be charged as well in the shooting. Two wrongs do not make a right!"
